
Kappa League Adopt-A-Highway Cleanup

At the January 16th Kappa League meeting, the Brothers of UM/W decided to tackle the uncomfortable subject of the Capitol Hill Riot that occurred on January6th in Washington DC. The discussion was led by Brothers DeWayne Wilcher, Shaun Alfred,

Jamerson Pender and Kappa League coordinator Charles Twitty. Brother Wilcher asked the Kappa Leaguers to express how they felt about the Capitol Hill Riot. Some of the Kappa Leaguers stated that they were upset about the riot. In addition, they stated that if it were African American citizens rioting at the Capitol building that it would have been handled completely different, citing the many Black Lives Matter protests over the death of George Floyd last summer. The Kappa Leaguers stated that President Donald Trump was to blame for riot. The Kappa Leaguers stated that his actions as President were unacceptable and caused a great division among the American people. Brother Wilcher asked the Kappa Leaguers to research and analyze all information that they are given and not let anyone else influence your decisions. Brothers Alfred and Pender asked the Kappa Leaguers about what they thought were the root causes of the riot. The Kappa Leaguers felt the root causes were fueled by President Trump and other people providing misleading and false information. The Kappa Leaguers discussed that they believed that many of President Trump followers are even more to blame because they didn't do their own research and have allowed themselves to consistently be lied to without impunity for President Trump.
